Missouri Valley Quilt Guild June 17, 2021 Minutes House of Prayer 6:30 pm

Opening Meeting - President Teresa Chase opened the meeting. There were 33 members in attendance.

Introduction of visitors/new members - no new members or visitors in attendance

Corrections or Additions to Minutes - The date for the National Teacher Event was corrected in the May Newsletter. The event will be held November 5-7, 2021.

Treasurer's Report -\$5,264.51 (of which 209.49 belongs to Warm Start)

Committee Reports:

National Teacher - The committee has received the DEWAC grant check for \$1,490. The classes have been chosen. On Friday, November 5, Krista Moser will teach Champagne & Pearls, Saturday she will teach Double Struck Star and on Sunday we will have the tea and trunk show. Sign-up for classes will begin August 9th. Members, as of August 1, will be allowed to sign up first.

The Sisters in Stitches volunteered to host the guild Christmas Party on December 2.

Old Business:

Our guild has challenged both the Hebron and Minot guilds to enter quilts in the State Fair. Quilts must be entered in the show by July 6. On Monday, July 19 Michelle and Sandi will deliver quilt entries to Minot. If you would like them to take your quilt, please contact them before July 19.

Michelle has reached out to the Capital Quilt Guild to see whether they need our help during Capital Affair in August.

Girl's Night in will be held at House of Prayer on Friday, October 15 from 6:30-11pm and Saturday, October 16 from 8am-4pm. Bring snacks to share. The group plans to order pizza on Saturday for lunch.

The guild still needs volunteers for President Elect and Secretary. Please consider volunteering your time and talents!

New Business:

A motion was made to donate \$100 to the State Fair to help fund prizes in quilting categories. The motion was seconded.

Announcements:

A member is selling a long arm quilting machine. The details were sent to members by email.

The Hebron guild will hold their show on Saturday, September 11.

Meeting Program: The guild rummage sale was held. It was a very large sale, with many items from former member Diane Rogness. The proceeds were \$630.

Treasurer's Report: \$5,264.51. Michelle will work up a budget for the upcoming year.

Discussion:

The guild picnic is on August 19 at Sertoma Park, Shelter 11. It's in the samelocation used for the picnic in 2020. The picnic is potluck, with the guild providing plates and silverware. Members are asked to bring their own drink and a dish to share. Members bringing a hot item to share should also bring an extension cord.

We still need volunteers for the offices of President Elect and Secretary.

The September meeting will be held at House of Prayer Church. Membershipdues of \$20 will be collected for the new year.

The State Fair had 191 quilts entered this year. Participation from our guild was good, with over 30 quilts being entered.

Capital A'fair is August 7 & 8. The Capital Quilters could use some help at the demonstration table. We will display a brochure for our upcoming National Teacher Event.

The National Teacher event will be held November 5, 6 & 7. Registration begins August 9th. Registration will open to non-members September 7th. Patterns will be available for discounted purchase through instructor Krista Moser, details will be given at a later date.

Still no decision on whether we will participate in Harvest Fest in September.
