Mock Pineapple/Diced Pineapple/Pineapple Nine Patch

Note: Pattern fee \$7.00 payable to the teacher in class (Tri-Recs ruler required)

All similar names for the same block ... just different settings. This pattern masquerades as a traditional pineapple but a quick piecing trick makes it fast for quilters of all skill levels.

Lecture & Trunk Show – Cathy is an experienced quilter and has written several quilting books and patterns. She has also developed a number of tools designed to make quilting easier for all. ## **Melon Mash Quilt**

#### **Instructor: Lorrie Hafner**

The "yummy" Melon Mash Quilt consists of only three main pieces. The three pieces are sewn together and mixed and mashed with three other melon blocks to make the "big block". Can't have a failure because templates are used for cutting melon pieces and you already know how to sew a scant quarter inch seam and how to press. The curves are easy and very little pinning is required. Easy, easy recipe! I made my first melon quilt without a book.

You will receive the ingredient list after signing up for class. (If you want to do a little premixing before class (cutting your pieces) the ingredient list will have special directions). It will be important to cut three melon sets from each fat quarter. Sewing directions will be waiting for you at Retreat.

The pastel Melon Mash quilt used 36 fat quarters and measures 75" before adding borders.

The tan Melon Mash measures 90" before finishing.....

Lorrie has been quilting for a few years & has enjoyed attending the Retreat for the past several years. She lives on a ranch South of Bison, SD with her husband, dog, cows, numerous horses and more sewing machines than she can use at one time. She has great depth in knowledge in garment sewing that now extends into quilting.







# Sixteenth Annual 'Frozen Fabric Frolic' Quilt Retreat Missouri Valley Quilters, Bismarck-Mandan Will be held at Camp of the Cross, Garrison ND February 17- 19, 2017 Quilt Retreat will begin at 5:00 PM Friday evening and will end 4:00

PM Sunday evening

\$150 Registration Fee will cover room, board and classes. (\$75 required with application.) Meals are provided. (Supper Friday evening. Brunch & Supper Saturday. Brunch Sunday)

(Cancellations before Feb. 14, 2016 will receive a refund minus a \$10 non-refundable registration fee.)

Accommodations are dormitory style cabins – (no bunk beds). Bring your own sleeping bag, pillow, towels, etc. Each cabin has its own bathrooms, but shower facilities are located in another building.

A limited number of "Private Rooms" are available for an additional \$35/person. Some of the rooms will accommodate two people, (2 single beds.) Bedding & towels are provided by the camp. These rooms will be filled on a "First comefirst served" basis. We cannot guarantee you a private room.

You will have your choice of two classes, or space will be provided to do your own projects.

(Each class will be for two days, giving time to perhaps complete a project)

Class size is limited to 16 and will be filled as registrations are received.

Applications will be accepted based on postmark, but will not be accepted early.

Open registration will begin January 1, 2017 for non-member of MVQ.
