1 Million Pillow Case Challenge

Thanks for continuing to support the 1 **Million Pillowcase Challenge** initiated by American Patchwork & Quilting magazine.

Current count is 440,822 cases donated to local organizations!

This past week, through the efforts of Bismarck/Mandan quilters of which Missouri Valley Quilters is a solid supporter, we donated 75 cases to the Adult Abused Resource Center to be used in three of our 22 designated organizations. Pam's House, Diane Zainhofsky's Hope House and Bonnie's Apartments were each presented with 25 pillowcases.

This effort was started in March of 2010, and since then, Bismarck/Mandan quilters have donated over **900 pillow-cases! Missouri Valley Quilters alone has contributed 200!**

Sewing Machines Plus and Bismarck Sewing and Quilting are both designated "collection" points for any pillowcases you wish to donate. Both shops then add them to the national tally.

You may also give cases to Jean Wolf at any meeting.

Frozen Fabric Frolic Classes

Wool Applique

Teachers: Del Rae Martin and Susan Schwarz

Are you ready for a novice teacher with a traditional bend and an experienced teacher with a contemporary flair to show you the ins and outs of wool dyeing and applique? If so, sign up for our class at the Frozen Fabric Frolic. Del Rae designed two different wall hangings and we have each done our own interpretations to give you ideas for yours. Susan will discuss and demonstrate the process of wool dyeing and you will have the opportunity to dye wool for the flowers in your wall hanging. Del Rae will share with you her tips and hints she has learned in her wool applique and Susan will share what she has found that works for her. Hopefully this improbable pair of teachers will be able to provide you the information you need to work with wool. If you do not want to use either of the patterns, you are welcome to bring your own new or partially completed project to work on in the class. There will be a kit fee for the wool for dyeing, and if you want a completely kitted project we will be able to do that as well for a fee





Crown Jewels

Teacher: Monica McCleary

An X-Block Creation from the book "Once upon a time in X-Block Land." This can be purchased from Sewing Machines Plus in Mandan. A 7 1/2" X-Block Ruler is required which also can be purchased at Sewing Machines Plus. This quilt is 75 x 89"

Fabrics required:

Assorted med/drk prints 5 1/4 yds.

Assorted Light and neutral print 2 3/4 yds.

I have used batik quilt fabric for all three of the X-Block quilts I have made and they are beautiful. *I will be instructing on the basic X-Blocks. If desired, the "crown jewels" border can be added. These are created from the "cut off" of the original X-Blocks we will be making for the body of the quilt. On the quilts I have made I have chosen to add a narrow border then a wider outer border rather than using the "cut off" from the original blocks. (The cut off comes from the cuts you make from the 7 1/2 "ruler after the 9 patch is made). I have used the excess fabrics from the cut off for the backs of a quilt for back art, table runners etc. I will bring samples of various projects I have used with the "cut off" or remaining fabric.

Eleventh Annual 'Frozen Fabric Frolic' Quilt Retreat Missouri Valley Quilters, Bismarck-Mandan Will be held at Camp of the Cross, Garrison ND February 15-17, 2013

Quilt Retreat will begin at 5:00 PM Friday evening and will end 4:00 PM Sunday evening

\$125 Registration Fee will cover room, board and classes. (\$60 required with application.) Meals are provided.

(Supper Friday evening. Brunch & supper Saturday. Brunch Sunday) (Cancellations before Feb. 10, 2013 will receive a refund minus a \$10 non-refundable registration fee.)

Accommodations are dormitory style cabins – (no bunk beds).

Bring your own sleeping bag, pillow, towels, etc.

Each cabin has its own bathrooms, but shower facilities are located in another building.

A limited number of "Private Rooms" are available for an additional \$35/person. Some of the rooms will accommodate two people, (2 single beds.) Bedding & towels are provided by the camp. These rooms will be filled on a "First come-first served" basis. We cannot guarantee a private room.

You will have your choice of two classes, or space will be provided to do your own projects.

(Each class will be for two days, giving time to perhaps complete a project)

Class size is limited to 16 and will be filled as registrations are received.

Applications will be accepted based on postmark, but will not be accepted early.

Members of Missouri Valley Quilters may send in their registration on December 1, 2012.

Open registration will begin January 1, 2013
