

Materials List

STANDARD SIZE PILLOW -makes two

(pillow size approx. 20" x 26") ... Finished Size- 20 1/2" x 30"

- *One and a half yard of (42"-44" wide) fabric for the body of the pillow cover
- One half yard of complimentary fabric for the "finished edge"
- * Matching thread

OUEEN SIZE PILLOW-makes two

(pillow size approx. 20" x 30")...Finished Size- 20 1/2" x 34"

- *One and three fourths yard of (+2"-44" wide) fabric for the body of the pillow cover
- *One half yard of complimentary fabric for the "finished edge"
- *Matching thread

KING SIZE PILLOW-makes two


(pillow size approx. 20" x 36")... Finished Size- 20 1/2" x 40"


- *Two and one eight yards of (42"-44" wide) fabric for the body of the pillow cover
- *One half yard of complimentary fabric for the "finished edge"
- *Matching thread

INSTRUCTIONS.....

*Body of pillow-square fabric ends and cut into two equal lengths approx. 27" long by "width of fabric"


"Edge of pillow-square fabric ends and cut into two equal lengths approx. 9" wide by "width of fabric"






*Roll body of pillow starting at the long (42"-44") edge...leaving a few inches unrolled at end.

*With right side together, wrap the 9" strip of "edge" fabric around the rolled body of pillow cover.




*Sew along pinned edge 1/4" from raw edge...removing pins as you sew.



*Reach in and grab the rolled body of the pillow cover...pulling it out of the looped "edge."

*Fress flat with seam allowance toward the "finished edge."





*Fold in half (wr		aligning "finished edge" and press again.

For STANDARD S	SIZE PILLOW-TO	im raw edges so folded pillow cover measures
	30 1/2	"by 21 1/2"

(*NOTE: For other sizes...trim raw edges of folded pillow cover 1/2" larger than finished size.)

Sew both unfinished seams (long "side seam" first) following the "French Seam Directions" below:


"French Seam Directions"

Step #1-With wrong sides together ... sew 1/4" from raw edge ... trim to "slight" 1/8" seam allowance.



Step #2-Turn inside out and press along seam line.

<u>"tep #3</u>—With right sides together sew approx. 1/4" from previously sewn seam (to "encase" raw edge.)



Step #4-Turn right side out and press along seam line.
